Our goal is to support students in identifying their interests, making informed course requests, and setting themselves up for a successful future.



Our Juniors competed in Districts in North Battleford on February 26 and 27. UCHS had 3 teams representing Doubles, Mixed and Boys events. All three teams brought home medals! Zane Lanegraff and Cole Ducherer brought home the banner, by going undefeated and winning gold. The Mixed team, of Tate Pool, Hunter Ireland, Brooke Bartley and Ariana Welsch earned a silver medal.





Welsh, Ryland Morin and Chester Miller showed their determination and skill by winning a Bronze medal. The young athletic success showcases the depth of talent coming out of the Unity Curling community.

At the Senior level, the Warriors proved they were a force at both Districts and Regionals. Unity was fortunate to host three major curling events, which was a

treat for our athletes and their fans. The grade 9 teams were able to compete in SR Districts in mid-February and proved they are ready to compete at the SR level. The Doubles team of Zane and Cole, continued to dominate by taking top spot, earning their way to Regionals. The mixed team dropped a game to McLurg, so had to fight their way through the B side and won silver, over the grade 9 Unity mixed team! It was a great battle!

UCHS and Unity Curling Club hosted Regionals for Doubles and Mixed on the weekend of February 28 and March 1. Eight teams attended from across the North West and the crowds were rewarded with excellent games. Unity Doubles beat Maidstone in 2 games and the Mixed team got their revenge and beat McLurg! Both Unity teams advanced to provincials!


lose, they play with heart, respect, and an unwavering team spirit.
