#### Fair Notice Letter





Dear Parents/Guardians:

The safety of our children is of top priority. We, the Living Sky School Division (LSKYSD) and Light of Christ Catholic School Division (LOCCSD), have been collaborating with our community partners and together we have developed a plan for responding to high-risk behaviours. High-risk behaviours include, but are not limited to, possession of weapons, bomb threats and threats to injure oneself or others.

This letter is to inform you that LSKYSD/LOCCSD have administrative procedures that require principals to initiate the completion of a "threat assessment" in all cases of students displaying any type of high-risk behaviour. Should you wish to review the "Administrative Procedure 626 - Violence Threat/Risk Assessment" (LOC) or "Administrative Procedure 4.17 Safe Schools" (LSKYSD) please visit our websites at either w ww.loccsd.ca or ww.lskysd.ca. The purpose of a threat assessment is to determine how best to support high-risk students so that their behaviour does not become hurtful or destructive. If your child comes home and tells you that a student has behaved in a threatening way at school, please advise your principal and be assured that your principal will be taking measures to deal with the situation in a positive and proactive manner. If your principal invites you to a meeting to discuss safety concerns about your own child, please be assured that the procedure is being followed and that the primary goal is safety, not punishment.

This letter is intended to serve our community with fair notice that we, as school communities, will not accept "no response" to a serious threat. Our goal is to respond to all threats in a professional manner that provides for a healthy and caring learning environment.

We are pleased to provide, in conjunction with our community partners, a safe environment for all of our students.



#### **WARRIOR FOOTBALL**



The Warrior Football team headed into fall camp the last week of August to get ready for the 2024 season. The Warriors have 24 players for their 2024 roster. This year the Warriors have 9 Grade 12 students including: Brandt Gilbert, Dawson Rusk, Zen Halter, Noah Gumpinger, Jagr Lewin, Mateo Rutley, Rhett Berki, Ethan Berotia, Kieran Wildeman. The Warriors opened their season in Biggar on September 5 with a convincing 36-18 victory. The Warrior Defense recorded 6 interceptions, including two by Dawson Grant. On offence the Warriors scored 5 times, with Rylan Fauth catching a pass for a touchdown and returning an interception for a touchdown. The Warriors headed to Eatonia on September 12. The Warrior offence started strong with a Dawson Grant TD run, and never looked back. Dax L'Heureux had a dominant game on the ground, while Josh Delhommeau and Ethan Bertoia had strong defensive efforts to help the Warriors leave Eatonia with a commanding 60-6 victory. The Warriors opened their home schedule on September 19 against Rosetown. The Unity defense had two terrific defensive stands deep in their own end to hold back the Royals early in the first quarter. Shortly after, a swing pass to Dawson Grant resulted in a 70-yard touchdown for the Warriors. Unfortunately, despite strong defensive games from Zen Halter and Ethan Bertoia, and a good game on the ground from Noah Gumpinger, the Warriors were not able to stop Rosetown, and finished with a 32-8 loss. The Warriors are preparing for their annual "Friday Night Light's" game on Friday, September 27. The game will feature pink jerseys and a donation from the 50/50 earnings will be made to the Canadian Cancer Society in honor of October's Breast Cancer Awareness initiative.
