Mrs. Orobko—Nathan is a hard-working student. He is kind to his peers and leads by his positive example in the classroom.


Mrs. Hrynuik—Nathan is responsible while cooking in the kitchens, always asking questions if he is unsure and being the very example of safety that others follow.

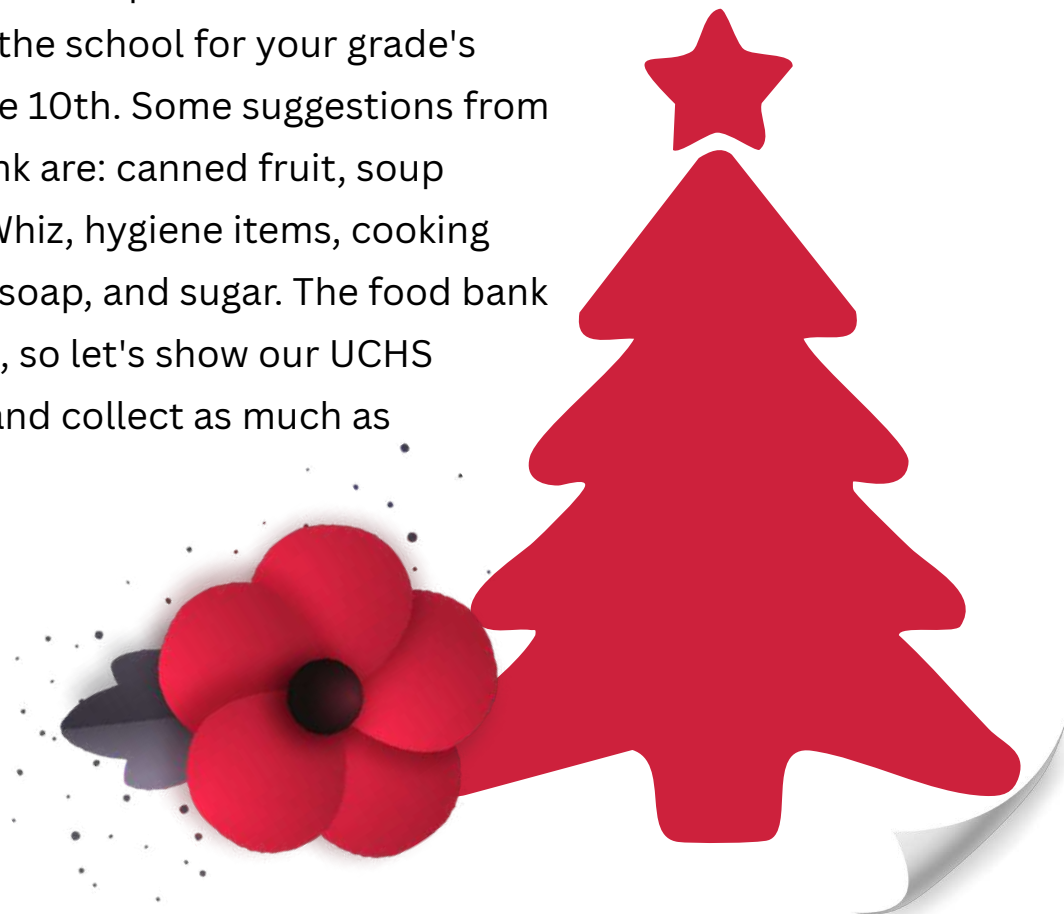
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# THE 12 DAYS OF CHRISTMAS

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## FOOD BANK DONATION

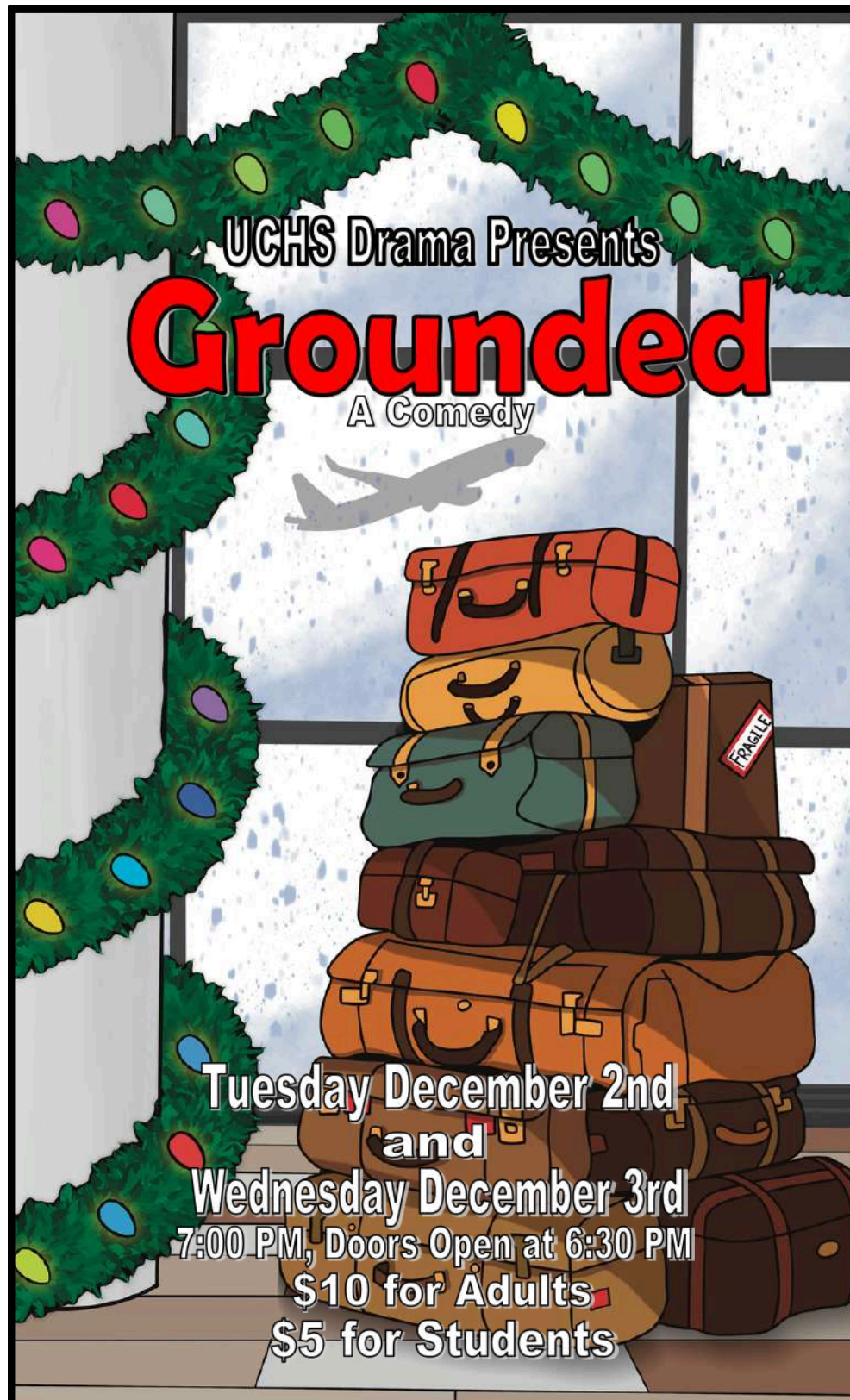
